# Breast cancer license tags now fund genetic testing

In March, Georgia CORE staffers visited with select legislators during the General Assembly to share the accomplishments of Georgia's breast cancer license tag program. For each breast cancer license tag purchased or renewed from the Georgia Department of Revenue, \$22 goes to pay for screenings,



genetic testing, education and treatment for Georgians without insurance that are also below the poverty level.

"In 2003, we passed legislation to sell breast cancer license tags and expand breast cancer services for women in need," said Sen. Renee Unterman. "In 2013 alone, nearly \$1.1 million from the proceeds was used by 16 community organizations across the state to provide these services," she added. Read more

Georgia CORE's president Nancy M. Paris, MS, FACHE recently presented on Health Equity in Cancer Care at the American College of Healthcare Executives meeting in Chicago. She was able to highlight some of the important work going on in Georgia to reduce cancerrelated health disparities in our state.

Paris joined Ruth O'Regan, MD, associate professor of Hematology and Medical Oncology at the Winship Cancer Institute, to co-author a poster presented at the first-ever NCI/ASCO Clinical Trials Symposium. Their study concluded that Georgia's network of community and academic oncologists has increased access to clinical trials statewide, conducted cooperative group and phase II trials, activated trials in geographically disbursed sites and accrued 56 percent minority patients to Georgia CORE's investigator initiated breast cancer trials, for which Dr. O'Regan serves as Principal Investigator.
