Seay is the New Georgia CORE Board Chairman



Thomas E. Seay, MD, PhD is the new chairman of the Georgia CORE Board of Directors. Dr. Thomas Seay has been a part of Georgia CORE since its inception, serving on the executive committee for development and incorporation of the organization.

Dr. Seay is principal investigator for the Atlanta Regional Community Clinical Oncology Program. He has served as an advocate for incorporation of an integrated electronic medical record in the community oncology practice setting.

Dr. Seay received his Doctor of Medicine from the James H. Quillian College School of Medicine in Johnson City, Tennessee, and completed a residency in internal medicine and a fellowship in hematology/oncology at the Emory University School of Medicine. He received his Doctor of Philosophy in Biomedical Sciences (Molecular Immunology) from East Tennessee State University. Dr. Seay is board-certified in Internal Medicine and Medical Oncology.

GOG Consortium Makes Strides toward Full Membership

The Georgia CORE Gynecologic Oncology Group Consortium is currently a provisional member of the Gynecologic Oncology Group (GOG). The consortium is making strides to become full members by achieving the mandated membership points for patient enrollment this summer.

Currently active members of the Georgia CORE GOG Consortium, Mercer/Memorial University and the Medical College of Georgia, are on target to accrue half of the points by mid-year, ensuring that provisional membership status is maintained. The sites are accruing a greater percentage of patients to high priority GOG studies.

The designation of Emory University's Winship Cancer Institute as an NCI cancer center marks a tremendous accomplishment for the state of Georgia. Prior to the designation, Georgia was the largest state, and Atlanta the largest city, lacking an NCI-designated cancer center.

Schnell is New Chief Medical Officer



Frederick M. Schnell, MD, FACP is the new Chief Medical Officer of Georgia CORE. Dr. Schnell led the development and incorporation of the Georgia Center for

Oncology Research & Education. He was the founding chair of the Georgia CORE Board of Directors and served on the executive committee through 2008. Dr. Schnell is a medical oncologist in private practice with Central Georgia Cancer Care, PC, with offices in Macon and Warner Robins, Georgia. He is also clinical assistant professor in the Department of Medicine at the Mercer University School of Medicine in Macon.

Dr. Schnell earned his Doctor of Medicine at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio, and completed a residency and fellowship at Emory University. He is board-certified in Internal Medicine and Medical Oncology. He serves as the principal investigator at his site for clinical trials conducted in collaboration with academic, industry, and National Cancer Institute Cooperative Groups. He is a past president of GASCO and was instrumental in the development of the Central Georgia Regional Program of Excellence. Dr. Schnell is chair of the Community Oncology Alliance, and a recipient of the ASCO community research award.
